

We Can't Keep ChatGPT Out of the Classroom, so Let's Address the 'Why' Behind Our Fears (EdSurge)

Excerpt from the article: "I asked students to enter the same essay prompt they'd written back in October into ChatGPT, then compare their work to ChatGPT's instant essay. They scored ChatGPT's work using the same College Board rubric their essays were evaluated against. Once they were done scoring, the students determined that the computer was no match, confirming that it lacked the specificity, musicality and soul that their writing exhibits."

What's the Right Mindset for Teaching English Learners? A Teacher Explains (EdWeek)

Excerpt from the article: "I remember [when I was a student] and EL students started moving in, it was different because there weren't very many EL kids. I know some people were like, 'What am I gonna do? I don't know what to do with this student. How do I teach them?'"
